Background

GOAL: To create messages and tools to promote the idea that Medicaid is good and useful. Tools will be usable by people from any organization with any population.

WHO: Produced by leaders from organizations throughout Colorado that have an interest in protecting and expanding Medicaid. Funded by the Colorado Health Foundation. Coordinated by the Colorado Cross-Disability Coalition.

WHEN: Messaging drafted during the summer of 2016. Messaging campaign launched early fall of 2016 and continued for remainder of year.

How: Using an inclusive process, messages were drafted, revised and vetted by Medicaid stakeholders.

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



Regular dental care through Medicaid means kids avoid tooth decay, the most common chronic disease among children.




People who need wheelchairs can use Medicaid to increase their mobility and independence.
