Responsive Grants Program – Objective Definitions

Primary Care Workforce

The Foundation defines primary care as the provision of integrated, accessible health care services by clinicians who are accountable for addressing a large majority of personal health care needs, developing a sustained partnership with patients, and practicing in the context of family and community. The primary care workforce continuum includes all of the workforce positions that are critical to delivering person-centered and integrated primary care (e.g. medical assistants, behavioral health therapists, dental hygienists, nurses, physicians, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, etc.)

Young Adult Resiliency

The Foundation defines resiliency for young adults – ages 18 to 26 – as coping and functioning despite adversity or trauma. The process of, capacity for, or outcome of successful adaptation in the context of risk or adversity. It is generally accepted that protective factors, both within an individual and in his or her environment, can help moderate risk for adversity and therefore facilitate “resiliency” that can in turn reduce the likelihood of poor outcomes such as depression, anxiety or substance use.
